Educated at Royal College, Colombo; Ceylon University College; and Ceylon Law College.

Married Elina B. Rupasinghe on February 28, 1935, and has one son, Ravindra Vimal.

Advocate of the Supreme Court of Ceylon and was sworn in in 1932.

23 July 1977 — Appointed Prime Minister of the Republic of Sri Lanka, and Minister of Defence, Minister of Planning & Economic Affairs and Minister of Plan Implementation after the General Election of July 1977. The United National Party won 143 out of 168 seats at the General Election.

4 February 1978 — Appointed First Elected Executive President of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka.

February 1978 — Leader of the Sri Lanka Delegation to the Regional Meeting of the Commonwealth Heads of Government in Sydney, Australia.

Oct./Nov. 1978 — State Visit to India and Nepal.

Aug./Sept. 1979 — Leader of the Sri Lanka Delegation to the 6th Non-Aligned Summit Conference, Havana, Cuba.

September 1979 — State Visits to Japan and Singapore.

September 1980 — Leader of the Sri Lanka Delegation to the Commonwealth Heads of Government Regional Meeting, New Delhi.

September 1981 - State Visit to Saudi Arabia.

20 October 1982 — Elected Second Executive President at the Presidential Elections.

4 February 1983 — Declared and affirmed Second Executive President and the First Elected Executive President of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka.

February 1983 — Leader of the Sri Lanka Delegation to the 7th Non-Aligned Summit Conference, New Delhi, India.

June 1983 — State visit to Italy, Egypt and Bahrain.

November 1983 — Leader of Sri Lanka Delegation to the Commonwealth Heads of Governments, Meeting—New Delhi, India.
