## No. 19 of 1892.

An Ordinance to provide for the further appropriation of certain Unclaimed Balances from the Loan Board.

WHEREAS by the Ordinance No. 4 of 1865, intituled "An Ordinance for the better regulation of the Loan Board," provision has been made for the transfer to the Treasury of certain unclaimed balances to be appropriated to purposes cognate to, or connected with, the administration of justice: And whereas it is expedient to appropriate a portion of such balances for such purposes: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Preamble.

1 A sum not exceeding eighty-one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight rupees shall be issued and applied to the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

A sum not exceeding eighty-one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight rupees from unclaimed balances in Loan Board may be applied for certain public purposes.

Treasurer to pay such moneys as Governor may direct. 2 The Treasurer of the island shall from such balances as aforesaid issue and pay the said sum of eighty-one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight rupees for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, in such proportions as the Governor by any warrant or order in writing, to be signed by him, shall from time to time order and direct; and the payments so to be made shall be chargeable upon and be payable out of the said balances.

Treasurer to receive credit for such payments. 3 The Treasurer shall from time to time be allowed credit in his accounts for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid; and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
