An Ordinance to continue the Ordinance No. 2 of 1879, intituled "An Ordinance to check Coffee Stealing," for a further term of one year.

Title.

THEREAS by the 18th section of the Ordinance No. 2 of 1879, intituled "An Ordinance to check Coffee Stealing," it was enacted that the said Ordinance should be in force until the expiration of two years from the passing thereof and to the end of the then Session (if any) of the Legislative Council: whereas by the Ordinance No. 4 of 1881, intituled "An Ordinance to continue the Ordinance No. 2 of 1879, intituled 'An Ordinance to check Coffee Stealing," the said Ordinance No. 2 of 1879 was continued in force for a term of two years from the date of the passing of the Ordinance No. 4 of 1881 aforesaid, and thenceforth to the end of the then Session of the Legislative Council: And whereas the said term will expire at the end of the present Session of the Legislative Council, and it is expedient to continue the same for a further period: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :-

Preamble.

The said Ordinance No. 2 of 1879, intituled "An Ordinance to check Coffee Stealing," shall remain and continue in force until the Thirty-first day of December, 1884, inclusive.
