An Ordinance to repeal the Ordinance No. 11 of 1846.

WHEREAS by Ordinance No. 11 of 1846 certain persons, to wit, George Crabbe, James Smith, and Joseph Read, were appointed trustees of the carriage road leading from Kadugannáwa to a point on the Gadadessa river, adjoining the Gadadessa estate, made by the proprietors of the several estates in schedule A to the said Ordinance mentioned, and were thereby authorized and empowered to put up, erect, and build in, upon, or across the said road, at such place as they should judge necessary, such toll gate or toll bar as to them should appear necessary for the purpose of collecting certain tolls in schedule B to the said Ordinance mentioned and set forth, to be applied as well towards the keeping the said road in good order and repair for the use of such proprietors as towards the other purposes in the said Ordinance mentioned: And whereas no tolls have for many years been collected as in the said Ordinance provided, and all the estates in the said schedule

A mentioned have long since been abandoned by the proprietors thereof, and the said road has fallen into disrepair, and all the said trustees have long since died or left the island, and no persons have been elected as trustees in their place, and it has therefore become impossible to carry into effect the provisions in the said Ordinance with reference to such tolls as aforesaid prescribed: It is therefore hereby enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Repeal of
Ordinance No. 11
of 1846.

That from and after the first day of January, 1890, the said Ordinance No. 11 of 1846 shall be of no force or effect whatsoever, and the said carriage road leading from Kadugannáwa to a point on the Gadadessa river, adjoining the Gadadessa estate, and all toll gates, toll bars, and other buildings put up, erected, or purchased by the said trustees for the collection of tolls thereon, and any land purchased or acquired by the said trustees under the provisions of the said Ordinance, shall thereafter become absolutely vested in the Crown.
