An Ordinance to amend the Ordinance No. 6 of 1875.

Preamble.

WHEREAS by the proviso contained in the 8th section of "The Colombo Harbour Ordinance, 1875," it is provided as follows: "Provided always that the total revenue so raised from the shipping frequenting the port of Colombo, inclusive of the pilotage dues levied under the

Masters Attendant's Ordinance, No. 6 of 1865, shall not exceed the amount which may be required (1) for the payment of the annuity and of the interest on any further loan raised under section 5 of this Ordinance; (2) for the maintenance of the works; and (3) for defraying such charges as may be incidental to the efficient management, pilotage, and lighting of the port:"

And whereas in the said proviso the words "or annuities" were inadvertently omitted after the word "annuity," and the expression "section 5" inadvertently used instead of the expression "section 7," and it is expedient to amend and rectify the said proviso in this respect: It is enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

The said proviso in the said 8th section of the said Ordinance No. 6 of 1875 shall, for all purposes, be read and taken as if it consisted of the following words and figures (that is to say) :- "Provided always that the total revenue so raised from the shipping frequenting the port of Colombo, inclusive of the pilotage dues levied under the Masters Attendant's Ordinance, No. 6 of 1865, shall not exceed the amount which may be required (1) for the payment of the annuity or annuities and of the interest on any further loan raised under section 7 of this Ordinance; (2) for the maintenance of the works; and (3) for defraying such charges as may be incidental to the efficient management, pilotage, and lighting of the port."-instead of the words and figures now appearing therein (that is to say) :- " Provided always that the total revenue so raised from the shipping frequenting the port of Colombo, inclusive of the pilotage dues levied under the Masters Attendant's Ordinance, No. 6 of 1865. shall not exceed the amount which may be required (1) for the payment of the annuity and of the interest on any further loan raised under section 5 of this Ordinance; (2) for the maintenance of the works; and (3) for defraying such charges as may be incidental to the efficient management, pilotage, and lighting of the port."
