

GOVERNOR'S ORDINANCE.

No. 56 of 1939.

MEDICAL COLLEGE (SPECIAL  
APPOINTMENT).

AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE SPECIAL PROVISION FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A PROFESSOR OF PHYSIOLOGY AND REGISTRAR OF THE CEYLON MEDICAL COLLEGE; AND FOR OTHER MATTERS CONNECTED WITH OR INCIDENTAL TO THE PURPOSES AFORESAID.

[12th December, 1939.]

WHEREAS by Article 22 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, as amended by the Ceylon (State Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1937, it is provided *inter alia*, that if the Governor shall consider that it is necessary in the interests of public order, public faith or other essentials of good government or to give effect to any of the provisions of that Order in Council for provision to be made by legislation, then in such case, notwithstanding any of the provisions of that Order in Council or of any Standing Orders made under that Order in Council, he may enact forthwith, as a Governor's Ordinance, a Bill containing such provisions as he may consider necessary :

Preamble.

And whereas the Governor, in the exercise of the powers vested in him by the aforesaid Article 22, considers that it is necessary that provision should be made by a Governor's Ordinance as hereinafter set out :

BE it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Ceylon Medical College (Special Appointment) Ordinance, No. 56 of 1939.

2. (1) Collingwood William Startup is hereby appointed, with effect from the eleventh day of November, 1939, to the office of Professor of Physiology at the Ceylon Medical College and to the office of Registrar of the Ceylon Medical College, and is hereby declared to have been at any time after that date entitled and to be entitled to assume such offices and to exercise, enjoy, perform and discharge the powers, privileges, duties and functions of such offices.

(2) The terms, covenants and conditions attaching to the appointment of the said Collingwood William Startup to the offices aforesaid shall be those set out in the Agreement dated the twenty-third day of September, 1939, signed by the said Collingwood William Startup and by Frederick George Bradstreet for the Crown Agents for the Colonies, London, acting on behalf of the Government of Ceylon; and the salary, remuneration, allowances or other emoluments of the said Collingwood William Startup are hereby authorised to be paid out of the public revenue and other funds of the Island, in accordance with the terms, covenants and conditions set out in that Agreement and the Financial Regulations of Government.

(3) The said Collingwood William Startup shall, for the purposes of the Penal Code, be deemed to be a public servant and shall, for the purposes of section 12 (c) of the Medical Ordinance or of any regulation made under section 14 of that Ordinance, be deemed to be a Professor of the Ceylon Medical College appointed by the Secretary of State.

(4) Save and except as hereinbefore provided—

(a) the provisions of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, as amended by the Ceylon (State Council) Amendment Orders in Council of 1934, 1935, 1937 and 1939, and of the Public Service Regulations shall apply to and in the case of the said Collingwood William Startup as they apply to or in the case of any public officer in the service of the Government of Ceylon;

(b) the provisions of the Medical Ordinance and of any other written law shall apply to and in the case of the said Collingwood William Startup as they apply to or in the case of a Professor or the Registrar duly appointed by or by authority of the Council of the Ceylon Medical College.

3. The provisions of this Ordinance shall have effect notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Medical Ordinance ; and where anything in this Ordinance is in any case or in any way inconsistent or in conflict with anything in the Medical Ordinance or in any other written law, the provisions of this Ordinance shall prevail.

Provisions of this Ordinance to prevail in case of conflict with other written law.

4. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of His Majesty the King, His Heirs and Successors, or of any body politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned in this Ordinance and those claiming by, from or under them.
