AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONTINUANCE IN FORCE AFTER DECEMBER 9, 1950, OF THE DEFENCE (EMER-GENCY SALE AND EXPORT OF COPRA) REGULATIONS, 1942.

[Date of Assent: December 6, 1950.]

WHEREAS the Defence (Emergency Sale and Export of Copra) Regulations, 1942, which have effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Act, 1945, of the Parliament of the United Kingdom, are due to expire on the tenth day of December, 1950:

And whereas it is expedient to provide for the continuance in force of those Regulations for a further period:

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and the House of Representatives of Ceylon in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Coconut Products (Special Provisions) Act, No. 32 of 1950, and shall come into operation on the ninth day of December, 1950 (hereafter in this Act referred to as "the appointed date").

2. The Defence (Emergency Sale and Export of Copra) Regulations, 1942, as in force at the appointed date, shall from the appointed date have the force of law by virtue of this Act and as though they were herein enacted.

3. This Act and the Regulations referred to in section 2 shall expire on the date appointed by the Minister by notification published in the *Gazette* under Regulation 2 of those Regulations as the date of termination of the period of suspension of the sections of the Coconut Products Ordinance specified in that Regulation.
