AN ACT TO AMEND THE HOLIDAYS ORDINANCE.

Volume III, Chapter 135, page 607.

[Date of Assent: December 21, 1957]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and the House of Representatives of Ceylon in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Holidays (Amendment) Act, No. 57 of 1957, and shall come into operation on January 1, 1958.

Short title and date of operation.

2. Section 6 of the Holidays Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as the "principal enactment") is hereby repealed.

Repeal of section 6 of Chapter 135.
